Conditions for entry

To be eligible entrants must complete an application form to be obtained from the Chief Executive and confirming the following requirements:

1. Completed not less than ten consecutive years on a farm or farms in the United Kingdom.
2. Entrants must have been in service on the same farm or with the same employer without intermission.
3. Entrants are eligible to receive the award only once.
4. Farm work completed before the entrant's fifteenth birthday will not count.
5. The award will be presented at the Show during the cattle parade.
6. The employer must be a member of the Surrey County Agricultural Society.

5. The prize winners will be announced by 2.00pm and a Surrey County Show shield will be awarded to the first prize winner at the cattle parade.
