WHATS NEW IN 2010?

HORSES

The two Scurry classes return with the championship taking place during the afternoon. Winter works on the park should relieve ground impaction and make better going in all horse arenas for 2010. Again everyone in the horsebox car park, warming up ring and horse rings will need a special wrist band which will also be their entry ticket. Please state on your entry form how many you will need (we do not allow more than a maximum of three per horse). Additional wrist bands may be bought in advance at the reduced rate of £10. Wearing the wrist bands will help our Society keep the horsebox park and warming up areas secure from heavy pedestrian traffic and hopefully provide a safer environment for everyone. WRISTBANDS ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE OR REFUNDABLE. Further entry forms can be downloaded from our website.

DONKEYS

This ever popular section returns and once again the classes have been incorporated into the main Schedule. As before, the rings will be separate from the horse rings in a different part of the showground and the classes are timed to start at 10.00am.

LIVESTOCK

Special travel allowances are available to our cattle and sheep exhibitors (cattle and sheep only for 2010) bringing three or more animals (inc. calves/lambs) to the show this year, to help with their travel costs. Breakfast vouchers will be allocated to cattle stockmen only.

Any Other Native Beef Breed – this section has been revised to read “Rare & Traditional British Breeds” and will hopefully encourage exhibitors to show more of our native breeds.

Dexters – this section has been classed as ‘Dual Purpose’.

NEW SECTION: Murray Grey

NEW SECTION: Any Other Dairy Breed – breeds will be defined as Brown Swiss, Dairy Shorthorn, Gloucester, Guernsey, Kerry and Northern Dairy Shorthorn.

Any Continental Breed or Cross sheep - due to very poor entries over the past few years, this section has now been cancelled.

Pigs – entries for the novelty classes can now be taken on the day.

Farm Service Award – there is now new criteria and wording for this award and a Society shield will be presented in the main ring during the cattle parade in future. See page 33 for more details.

ALL EXHIBITORS

The Surrey Hills Restaurant, situated by the Sheep and Cattle Lines, will be open from 12pm onwards on Sunday, 30th May serving meals. They source all locally farm produce and will be offering on:

Sunday, 30th May – Lunch at £10.95 (served 12-2pm). Family Barbeque from £3.50 for burgers, £5.45 for BBQ baps and salad or £10.95 for full meal option (6.30pm-8pm)

Monday, 31st May Show Day – Breakfast at £5.45 from approximately 6am. Lunch at £9.95 (12-2pm). Plus new Brunch Menu (10am-3pm)

Tea, coffee and snacks available from 12pm on Sunday and all day on Show Day. Showers will be available in the Stoke Park Farm changing rooms.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

SURREY COUNTY SHOW HOLDING NUMBER: 40/076/8002

1. To be eligible to make entries at members' rates an exhibitor must have paid the annual subscription for 2009 and pay his subscription for the current year, 2010. New members joining the Society this year must pay their subscription for the current year, and also their subscription for next year, 2011, in advance.
2. Where points count towards the award of a cup a first shall count 3, a second count 2 and a third count 1.
3. An exhibitor withdrawing any exhibit after entry will not be entitled to have entry fees returned, except under BSJA Rules. No refunds of entry loss or penning fees will be made if the show has to be cancelled for any reason beyond the control of the Society.
4. The Society reserves the right to cancel any breed section with three or less exhibitors, and to amalgamate or cancel classes in which there are less than six entries. In the event of a class having to be cancelled, the entry fees will be returned.
5. Any competitor intending to object to any exhibit must notify the same in writing to the Secretary within one hour of the class having been judged with a deposit of £25.00, which will be returned if the protest is sustained, but if in the opinion of the Executive Committee the objection is unreasonable, the deposit to be forfeited. The decision of the Executive Committee shall be final and binding to all parties.
6. Ages will be taken as on the date of the show.
7. The prescribed fee for each entry must be paid to the Society before the date of the show.
8. A judge's decision shall be final.
9. Neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants will be responsible for anything that may happen to exhibitors, their servants or any other person, or their respective property or animals, or to any exhibit at the show, and it shall be considered a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and that he shall be considered to indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings, claims or demands in respect thereof. Exhibitors acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and agree to having achieved a level of competency. In addition, they agree that they understand it is their responsibility to insure their property, animals and livestock whilst on the Showground and hold full public liability insurance.
10. All exhibitors should be a member of their respective Breed Societies'. Horse and pony classes will be judged according to their respective Society, Association or discipline rules.

EXTRACT OF RULES

11. DISPUTES

If any member, competitor or exhibitor violates any of the rules or regulations, he or she shall forfeit any prize or prizes to which he or she may be entitled and, if a member, be subject to expulsion from the Society. Any dispute or doubt arising on any questions connected with the Society shall be referred to the Council, whose decisions shall be final and binding on both parties. No exhibitor shall be present at any meeting, or sit on the Council while any question about which he or she is interested is discussed, unless he or she be asked to attend; and seven days' notice at least shall be given to the person concerned before the said power of expulsion be exercised and he or she shall be given an opportunity of appearing in person before the Council to show cause why he or she should not be so expelled. Any complaint, unless made by an official of the Society having no personal interest in the matter must be accompanied by a deposit of £25.00 in respect of horse, cattle, sheep and goat classes and £5.00 in respect of all other sections, which shall be liable for forfeiture should the Council consider the complaint a frivolous one which should not be made.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Council shall have power to interpret these rules and the regulations above mentioned if there should be any ambiguity or difference of opinion concerning the purport or intention of any rule or regulation. The Council shall have power to deal with any matter not provided for in these rules.

A FULL COPY OF THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE SOCIETY MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE SECRETARY ON REQUEST

The Surrey County Agricultural Society has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at the show. Animals, however, can sometimes be unpredictable. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid or prevent accidents occurring and must act upon the instructions of officials and stewards.

Animal Welfare Rules – Cattle, Buffalo, Camels, Sheep, Goats, Pigs, Equines: Pregnant animals of these types where 90% or more of the gestation period has elapsed may not be transported, including home from a show. In the case of cattle, if a live calf is born on the showground (whether prematurely or full term), animal welfare regulations do not allow its transportation for seven days after birth; exhibitors will have to share any additional costs or damages which the Society may incur as a result. New transport legislation only applies to commercial livestock journeys, not to those moving livestock to shows.

Disease - All Defra movement license conditions must be complied with, regarding disease status in the country. For up to date information, please contact your local Animal Health Office or check the Defra website www.defra.gov.uk. In the event that you are excluded from showing with us due to any last minute Defra disease legislation, Livestock exhibitors will be offered a FULL REFUND of entry fees up to three weeks before the show.

HORSES & PONIES

12. Measurement. In classes where there is a height restriction, entries may be measured on the ground in the shoes in which they are to be exhibited, unless an Official Measurement Certificate issued under the Joint Measurement Scheme is produced.
13. Dress. All those entering the rings with horses and ponies, or to attend horses and ponies, must be properly dressed, ie wearing suitable hats, jackets and their appropriate exhibit number where applicable. Hard Hats - anyone riding a horse or pony on the showground must wear a hat of a standard approved by the governing body of their respective horse/pony society, association or discipline and under whose rules they are exhibiting or competing.
14. No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete in any competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other members of the public are not put at risk or injury.
15. All horses and ponies should be accompanied by their Defra passport and will have received either a primary course or booster vaccination for equine influenza.

CATTLE, GOATS, PIGS & SHEEP

Owners of cattle, sheep and goats need to refer to current legislative requirements, ie The Cattle Identification Regulations 2007, The Sheep & Goats (Records, Identification and Movement)(England) Order 2009 (came into force 31st December 2009) and The Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 2007, and any Defra requirements concerning movement and disease.

CATTLE

IF POSSIBLE CATTLE SHOULD BE ON THE SHOW GROUND FROM 3PM AND NOT LATER THAN 7 PM ON SUNDAY, 30 MAY AND MUST REMAIN UNTIL 4.30PM ON SHOW DAY. EXHIBITORS LEAVING BEFORE THIS TIME MAY FORFEIT ANY PRIZE MONEY WON.

16. All movements of cattle must be recorded in the owner's movement records and movementsto and from shows must be reported to the BCMS within 3 days. All cattle should be accompanied by their passports or a certificate of registration. An officer of the Society will check all cattle documentation at the Show. The keeper reports movement off the holding, the Show reports movements on and off showground; and the keeper reports movement back onto the holding. The Society has to hold accurate records of all cattle/calves attending the show and movement dates.
17. Cattle must originate from premises which are not under DEFRA restrictions for tuberculosis or brucellosis. They must have been the bona fide property of the exhibitor on his holding at least two calendar months prior to the show.
18. Animals which calve, or show evidence of calving, whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending their removal from the showground.
19. Where an animal calves at full term and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and the Rose Bengal Plate Test and microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the show lines at the discretion of the Show Secretary.
20. Where an animal calves prematurely, or aborts, the Show DVM must be informed immediately. The animal must be placed in isolation in the approved accommodation and the full range of samples (including if at all possible a placental smear) should be taken. The animal will not be allowed to take further part in the show.
21. All other bovine animals from the same registered premises will not be allowed to compete further in the Show until negative results from certain tests carried out by a Veterinary Investigation Centre (RBPT and microscopical examination of a vaginal smear from the aborted animal) have been received. They can be returned home with the suspect animal after 7 days.
22. Bulls over 10 months of age should be rung. All bull handlers must be aged 18 years and over.
23. Cattle must be tied up, and exhibitors shall provide their own ties.
24. Any animal in milk on the showground with sealed teats will be disqualified.
25. When cows or heifers are shown as in calf the prize money will be withheld until a certificate of calving is produced to the Society.
26. Only the champion of each breed will be eligible to compete for the supreme championship. The reserve of the breed of the chosen champion will be eligible to compete for the reserve supreme championship. This rules also applies to the Dam and Daughter championships, but in the case of a group of three animals the reserve will NOT be eligible to compete.

27. Cattle may automatically transfer from In-Calf to In-Milk classes and vice versa.
28. No Warbled cattle will be allowed into the show without a completed declaration of treatment (form C) and this form can be obtained from the Local Authority or Defra.
29. Cattle belonging to herds with CheCS-accredited status must be accompanied by a Herd Certificate of Status, a copy of which should accompany the entry form. Members must ensure that they and their cattle comply with the Scheme rules concerning attendance at shows. For IBR, BVD and leptospirosis, introducing cattle back into an accredited herd after their attendance at a non-accredited show, involves isolating them from other cattle on the farm for 28 days prior to testing them for the appropriate disease(s). For Johne's disease, the risk of infection at a show is minimal and accredited cattle can be re-introduced to the main herd as long as they have been at the show for no more than 7 days and have not had direct contact with other cattle, particularly with their dung or soiled bedding.

SHEEP

30. All movements of sheep must be recorded in the owner's movement records. Movements of sheep to and from shows must be reported to local authorities on an AML 1 form within 3 days of movement. Your steward will collect your AML 1 forms on arrival. The Society has to hold accurate records of all sheep attending. Sheep must be in the possession of the exhibitors two months prior to the date of the show.
31. **ANIMALS IN THIS SECTION MUST BE ON THE SHOWGROUND BY 8.30AM AND REMAIN UNTIL 4.30PM. EXHIBITORS FOUND TO BE LEAVING BEFORE THIS TIME MAY FORFEIT ANY PRIZE MONEY WON.**
32. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on sheep, as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means, is prohibited.
33. All shearing rams and ewes intended for showing in Hampshire Down classes must be shorn bare on or after 1 January. Trimming is optional.
34. Maedi-Visna accredited accommodation will only be provided for sheep which have been signified as being of such status on the entry form and must be accompanied by the valid, fully completed SAC Form (green) – within expiry date. Members must ensure that they and their sheep comply with the Schemes' Rules concerning attendance at Shows. Copies of the rules are available from PSGHS, SAC Veterinary Services, St Marys Industrial Estate, Dumbries, DG1 1DX tel: 01387 267260.
35. Docking - sufficient tail must have been retained to cover the vulva of a female sheep and the anus of a male sheep, bred in the United Kingdom.

GOATS

36. All movements of goats must be recorded in the owner's movement records and movements to and from shows must be reported to your local authority on an AML1 within 3 days of movement and your steward will collect your AML 1 forms on arrival. The Society has to hold accurate records of all goats attending, including their herd book number and individual ID. Goats may move from show to show.
37. All stock exhibited must be CAE negative. Goats must arrive on the showground by 5pm on Sunday except those bringing stripping certificates who must be on the ground by 9pm. All must remain until 5 pm on Show Day. Goatlings must arrive by 9am on Monday and also remain until 6pm on Monday.
38. The Goat classes are held under the rules, regulations and recognition of the British Goat Society. All exhibits must be registered with the British Goat Society as in the ownership in the name of the exhibitor, the registered name and number being quote on the entry form. Kidding dates for goats in milk must be stated on the entry form. All goats in milk must have kidded or aborted a minimum of 30 days prior to the day of the show and must be non-pregnant. Further important details are covered in detailed information given on the goat classes.
39. The judge may withhold any award and his or her decision is final.

PIGS

40. All movements of pigs must be recorded in the owner's movement records and movements to and from shows must be reported to your local authority within 3 days of movement. Your steward will collect your AML 2 form on arrival. The Society has to hold accurate records of all pigs attending and movement dates.

ANIMALS IN THIS SECTION MUST BE ON THE SHOWGROUND BY 8.30AM AND REMAIN UNTIL 4.30PM. EXHIBITORS FOUND TO BE LEAVING BEFORE THIS TIME MAY FORFEIT ANY PRIZE MONEY WON.

ALL DOGS SHOULD BE KEPT UNDER STRICT CONTROL ON THE SHOWGROUND PARTICULARLY AROUND THE LIVESTOCK AREAS.

STEWARDS RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REJECT ANY ANIMAL DEEMED TO BE UNSAFE.

John & Rosemary Porter will award a **Shield(82)** for the Best Condition & Turnout. Special rosettes by the Miniature Mediterranean Donkey Association will be offered for the best miniature mare, stallion, youngstock filly/colt and gelding.

The In-Hand Champion Donkey at this show automatically qualifies for the relevant Championship at the Donkey Breed Society Annual Supreme Championship Show at Warwickshire College, Moreton Morrell Centre, Warwick on 21st-22nd August 2010, provided it is owned by a fully paid up member of the Donkey Breed Society. A donkey may win more than one Championship at shows, but will qualify only once for the DBS Champion Show. Donkey Regulations

1. No person may deliberately enter or show a donkey under a Judge who is known to have either owned, bred, leased, sold, produced or prepared that donkey. No donkey should be entered or shown under a judge who has owned, bred or leased the sire of that animal. The breeder is the mare owner. Where a donkey is leased, the lessee is the owner for the duration of the lease. This rule only applies to Breed and Driving classes.
2. Entering one donkey and exhibiting another is not permitted. Once judging has commenced, a donkey may not be led, ridden or driven in or out of the ring without the permission of the Judge.
3. No nomination entries are permitted.
4. DBS Members must carry their DBS membership cards at all times when showing for production on request in order to receive DBS rosettes.
5. A Judge will ask a competitor to leave the ring if either they or their donkey act in an improper manner.
6. Stallions and entire colts must be properly dressed in bridle and bit with the leading rein correctly attached to the bit. No person under the age of 17 may handle an entire donkey (foals excepted). No entire male donkey is allowed to compete in any children's classes.
7. Ridden Classes: Donkeys entered must be four years old and over and must have a correctly fitting bridle and saddle. When a child competes on a leading rein, the donkey must be led by a competent adults (18yrs and over) and leading reins must be attached to the noseband. All riders must wear an approved (PAS015) correctly fitting hard hat to conform to the current BSI standards.

8. Young Handlers Classes: To be judged on the ability of the Young Handler and not on the conformation of the donkey. A Young Handler is one who has not attained their 16th birthday on the day of the Show.
9. Driving Classes: Donkeys entered must be 4 years old or over. When a person of 17 years of age or under is driving a stallion an experienced adult Whip (18 years and over) must be in the vehicle at all times. An adult with a leading rein must be in the ring throughout the class when Junior Whips (15 years and under) are competing. The minimum age for a junior whip is 10 years old. This class will be judged as an Exercise Vehicle class; judging will be on the performance of the donkey and provided the vehicle and harness fit correctly and are clean and safe, they will not be considered in the judging.
10. Championships: the 1st and 2nd prizewinners from each class to parade in the ring wearing the appropriate rosettes they have already won. Please note, Class 56 Best Condition & Turnout does not qualify for the Championships.
11. Please indicate on your entry form whether you are bringing a horsebox or trailer and whether there is one vehicle or more. Also indicate the number of entry passes (3 is the maximum per entry)
12. Further passes can be bought in advance of the show at the special exhibitor rate of £9 each or at the full rate on show day tel: 01483 890810.
13. Passes, vehicle labels and numbers will be sent out approximately three weeks before the show.
14. Classes will start at 10.00 am with class 56 and follow on.
15. Rosettes are offered to 6th place.

Exhibitors will be supplied with a vehicle label and admission passes. No-one may enter the showground without an admission pass. Please display the vehicle label in your windscreen. Only vehicles towing trailers and horseboxes may enter the donkey parking area.
